



PROGRESS REPORT

May 1997 - July 1997

UNESCO/AGFUND PROJET 522/LEB/10

Training Programme for Out-of-School Youth and Adults in Lebanon

Several coordination meetings were held since September 1996, between the Ministry of Displaced and UNESCO/Beirut in order to prepare the launching of the project. The UNESCO/AGFUND project started on the 1st of May 1997.

- A. Based on the objectives of the joined act between the Ministry of displaced and UNESCO in the fields of education, social reintegration and rehabilitation of youth to acquire the needed skills in the reconstruction and development of their regions and country, 2 specialists in community development have been recruited (Terms of Reference attached as per annex 1 & 2), the UNESCO team conducted the following activities:
- 1) Field visits were conducted to the Chouf coastline schools (Rmeileh, Jieh, Naameh, Haret-El-Naameh) followed by meetings with the directors in order to assess the situation of the schools including infrastructure, equipment, training programs and finally, detailed reports were developed for the mentioned schools.
- Agreements were done with the Chouf coastline schools directors to initiate environmental clubs in these schools, this project will start at the beginning of the 1997/1998 academic year and it will be implemented later on in other schools upon completion and evaluation of the project.
- 3) Several meetings were held with the Chouf coastline social clubs to initiate environmental projects on solid wastes recycling.
- 4) Coordination with the local committee of returnees in Damour to initiate a reforestation project for about 3000 trees on Sunday 25 June 1997.
- Organization of youth activities for summer 1997 with the cooperation of the youth department in the Ministry of displaced including 7 sport tournaments and 4 summer camps in the villages of Naameh, El-Dalhamieh, Majd-al-Maoush, Mansouriet-Bahamdoun.
- Coordination with the "Rehabilitation and Development Center" and the "Youth Association for Blind" for the organization of 2 youth camps during the month of August 1997, the first in the village of Abay and the second in the village of Dlhamieh.
- 7) Participation in the organization of training sessions on "conflict transformation by peaceful means" on 26, 27 and 28 May 1997 in the premises of the Ministry of Displaced in Dekwaneh and the organization

of meetings for the specialist Johan Galtung with the media and the universities.

- 8) Attending workshops o 20 and 21 May 1997:
 - the first for the local voluntary organizations forum on the "Local and Development Sectors in Lebanon"
 - the second for the NGOs forum on the "Rights of the Vulnerable Groups".
- Occidente with the youth department in the Ministry to create youth club forums in the regions of return, and to organize meetings with the activists. It is worth mentioning that some of these forums have progressed a lot on issues such as organization and setting objectives and work plans (e.g. Chouf forum clubs, Alley forum clubs).
- 10) Collection of baseline data about the needs for youth centers in the region and preparation of defined project for this purpose.
- Field assessment on the situation and needs of the villages of Naameh and Mansourieh-Bahamdoun in order to initiate projects for these pilot villages as stipulated in the strategy of the "AIDOUN" program.
- 12) Elaboration of the cost of some infrastructure projects for 15 villages scattered in the Cazas of Chouf and Alley.
- Data collection on dispensaries for 12 villages in the Cazas of Chouf and Alley.
- 14) Elaboration of a proposal for the Ministry of Displaced concerning the redistribution of the social services center in the regions of return in order to suggest it to the Ministry of Social Affairs.
- B. A workshop on "Conflict transformation by peaceful means" has been organized at the Ministry of Displaced Dekwaneh from 26-28 May 1997 (refer to annex 3). It has been presented by Dr. Johan CALTUNG, Professor of Peace studies who trained the persons in-charge or involved with the resettlement issue on how to deal with the resettlement by peaceful means, he created a forum within the Ministry of Displaced, to promote local and national reconciliation by discussing best approaches and practices to manage reconciliation in a post-conflict society and identified the mechanisms suitable to the resettlement of the displaced: how to assist the youth in strengthening their reconciliation role.

- C. Upon the request of the Ministry of Displaced a photocopy machine OLIVETTI 8020, 20 pages/minute with an automatic document feeder and a 10 Bin sorter has been purchased.
- D. Most of the activities such as group training and workshops will be held during this summer.—Around US\$. 27,000 will be allocated on BL-32 as noted in the second budget breakdown (Ref. to annex 4).

PROJECT TITLE

training and empowerment of facilitators on "conflict transformation by peaceful means"

JUSTIFICATION

The war has caused the displacement of 90.000 families from their village of origin. The Lebanese government has set up a special ministry to deal with this issue and assist the displaced to return. Several committees (return and resident committees) were established to prepare the local reconciliation.

From previous experiences, the program Aidoun/UN.RSRD has decided to strengthen the role of the youth for a sustainable reconciliation by promoting reconciliation and civic values among them.

However the people working within the Ministry of displaced and the UN.RSRD program/Aidoun have to assist the committees and the youth in the peace-building process for development in post-conflict society.

This type of training is needed to provide skills to those involved with the resettlement of displaced persons. It can enhance their capacities to deal with such issues and gives them an active role as facilitators by promoting a culture of peace.

On the other side, the students from different universities (Lebanese, A.U.B., Saint-Joseph, N.D.U) can benefit from the syllabus on Peace Education developed by DR Galtung.

OBJECTIVES

- 1- to train the persons in charge or involved with the resettlement issue on how to deal with the resettlement by peaceful means.
- 2- to create a forum within the Ministry of displaced and the project UN.RSRD (Aidoun) to promote local and national reconciliation by discussing best approaches and practices to manage reconciliation in a post-conflict society.
- 3- to benefit from the various experiences (ex-Yugoslavia, Korea etc...) and to share the lebanese experience in order to identify the mechanisms suitable to the resettlement of the displaced: how to assist the youth in strengthening their reconciliation role.
- 4- to give the opportunity for the new generation, in the universities, to be acquainted with this concept.

LONG TERM OBJECTIVE

To promote the concept of "conflict transformation by peaceful means" within the youth concerned by the displacement and the youth in general.

SHORT TERM OBJECTIVES

The trainees will be able to:

- 1- assist the youth in initiating joint development programs and future strategies of peace-building.
- 2- train the youth and the local population on the techniques of conflict transformation by peaceful means based on local cultural heritage.
